Riverview earns GREAT Businesses certification from the City of Gresham

(VANCOUVER, Wash.) – Riverview Community Bank’s Gresham branch recently achieved certification as a “GREAT” business from the City of Gresham’s Department of Environmental Services. The certification recognizes Riverview’s completion of the Gresham Resource Efficiency Assistance to (GREAT) Businesses program, in which Riverview worked with program staff over a ten-month period to integrate sustainability into daily operations.

“When the branch was approached by the City of Gresham to be part of the GREAT program we knew we wanted to participate,” said Vice President and Gresham Branch Manager Casey Ryan. “The City’s commitment to working with businesses to become more environmentally conscious is commendable, and we wanted to do our part to learn sustainable solutions that we could exercise on a daily basis.”

The process, which started in January 2013, entailed regular site visits in which City staff advised Riverview in recycling and solid waste, storm water pollution prevention, water and energy conservation, and wastewater management. Riverview completed the process late September, and earned its two-year certification from the City this October. Per program requirements, the bank will go through site visits again in 2015 to renew its certification.

“We’re proud to have earned our certification, but our efforts to improve aren’t finished,” Ryan added. “We’ll continue to explore additional ways we can save energy and preserve resources in our operations.”
